



Cleveland Clinic Center for Neurological Restoration is committed to providing the best care available for neurological disorders, and it has backed this commitment with investments in cutting-edge technologies and new staff, thus reducing wait times for new consultations. We recently hired three new neurologists, all fellowship trained in movement disorders: Drs. Hubert Fernandez, Michal Gostkowski and Joseph Rudolph. With their addition, our staff is now able to see patients at the main campus, Euclid Hospital, Lakewood Hospital, Willoughby Hills Family Health Center and Chardon Road Medical Office Building.

We have also relocated to a new, larger space for evaluating you and your loved ones. Effective Monday, January 17, 2011, providers in the Medical Movement Disorders Section of the Center for Neurological Restoration began seeing patients at a different site on our main campus: the third floor of the Mellen Center, 1950 E. 89th St., just north of Euclid Avenue.

We moved because we were outgrowing our space on the third floor of the S Building. With the support of the Neurological Institute, we now occupy space at the Mellen Center that is designed specifically for managing chronic neurological disorders. You will notice the ample exam rooms and corridors and the wide doors. Our entire main campus team of neurologists, neurosurgeons, psychologists, psychiatrists and specialized nurses is at the Mellen Center, reducing the need for you to visit multiple locations in one day. We believe this arrangement will be more convenient for you and your family.

Parking is available in the surface lot at the Mellen Center, which can be entered from E. 89th Street. Please note that this lot is unattended, and payment for parking can be made only by credit card.
