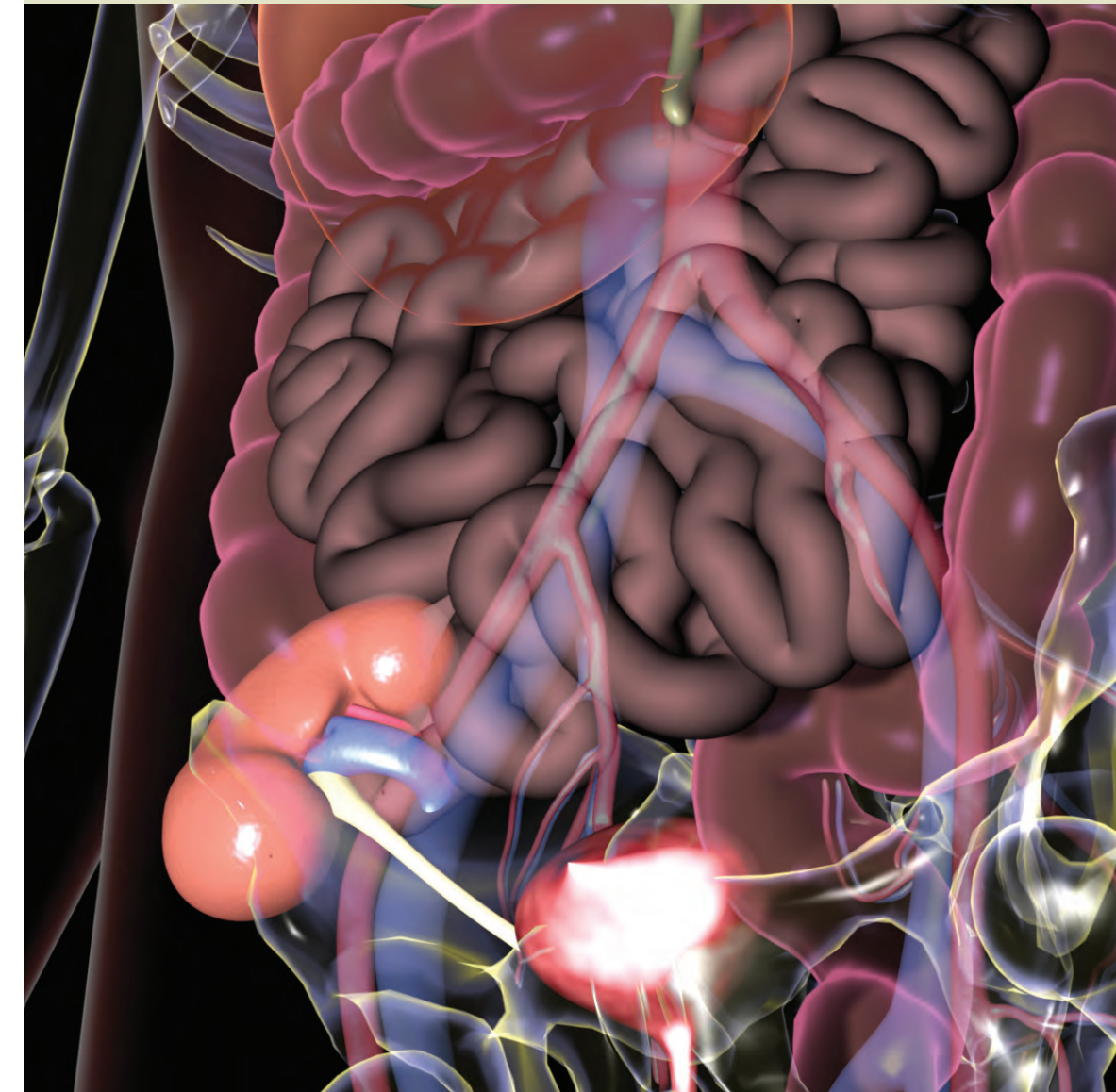

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# Contentious Issues in Organ Transplantation

## Description

This innovative conference will address contemporary issues in the field of organ transplantation with the principal aim of disseminating a practical and actionable approach to key challenges and controversies facing the field. Significant shifts in regulatory oversight and factors governing organ allocation, costs and quality of care have also occurred. Discussions on these phenomena are often segmented, partisan, and lack a focus on patient perspectives. “Contentious Issues in Transplantation-A Colloquium” is a three-day innovative conference designed to juxtapose representatives from the academic, clinical, political, regulatory, industry, patient advocacy, and research communities. The format will inspire constructive debate on key issues in a highly visible and interactive environment. Participants in the conference will be challenged to describe the current status of contentious issues in transplantation and consider future implications with particular emphasis on the ultimate goal of enhancing patient care and research.

## Young Investigators Forum

### Deadline for Abstract Submission: August 28, 2009

A young Investigators forum will provide opportunities for Young and Minority Investigators to present their work and interact with established investigators in the field. Young Investigators are those in training (medical students, residents or fellows in medicine, surgery, nephrology or transplantation, transplant professionals (coordinators, nurses, pharmacists, organ procurement specialists, statisticians) or within the first 5 years of their first faculty/staff appointment in the relevant speciality/subspeciality/transplant-related profession. Minority investigators and trainees will self-identify as such based on current census bureau norms. Trainees and young investigators will need to submit the prescribed form letter from their program director or department chair verifying trainee status. Young and minority investigators frequently lack exposure to these key issues during their training. A key theme of this conference will be the education and mentoring of young and minority investigators in the context of a symposium designed specifically for these attendees. These individuals will interact with some of the top investigators and thinkers in the field which could then enrich transplant outcomes research in the future.
