_	Aspirin/Plavix: Take as directed. Tylenol, Advil and ibuprofen are NOT aspirin.
-	Diabetes Medications (insulin and oral medications): Take as directed by your doctor. If you did not get instructions, we will let you know how to take these medications when you call for your arrival time.
-	Anticoagulants ("blood thinners"): Coumadin: Stop taking the medication 3 days before your procedure. If you have a left ventricular assist device (LVAD), do not stop taking Coumadin. Xarelto, Eliquis, Pradaxa: Stop taking the medication 48 hours before your procedure.
-	Diuretics ("water pills"): DO NOT take diuretics the day of your procedure unless your doctor tells you to. If you are having a right heart catheterization, do not stop taking your diuretics so we can tell how well your medications are working.
-	Allergy: If you are allergic to iodine (IVP dye), you will need to take a steroid medication (prednisone) the night before and the morning of your procedure. Please make sure your doctor orders this medication for you.
