

VISITATION GUIDELINES

We're using four statewide visitation levels — yellow, orange, red and purple — to protect our patients and caregivers and limit the spread of COVID-19. The visitation levels are based on data about how COVID-19 is spreading, including state and county public health information. Even when you can't visit in person, we encourage you to stay connected virtually.

These guidelines are being put in place for the safety of our patients, caregivers and community. Thank you for your understanding.

PLEASE NOTE: All visitors must be at least 18 years old and wear a mask, symptom screen and sanitize their hands. Visitors to patients who are COVID-19 positive must follow safety guidelines specific to those units. If you have tested positive for COVID-19, you can visit a patient 10 days after testing positive. If you have been exposed to someone who tested positive for COVID-19, you can:

1. Visit a patient 14 days after exposure if you are not fully vaccinated for COVID-19 or
2. Visit a patient with proof of vaccination if you are fully vaccinated for COVID-19 and are asymptomatic.

Visitation guidelines are subject to change if safe physical distancing isn't possible. Compassionate exceptions permitted when necessary.
