Empathy and Valuing Every Person Lecture Series: Three Phases of COVID-19 experiences

3rd Annual event in honor of Dr. Anthony Thomas, Jr

Hosted by Center for Bioethics

Inspired by Dr. Anthony Thomas, Jr.'s valuing of every person with whom he came into contact no matter their background, appearance, or social status, we invite insights gained through moments of "Empathy and Valuing Every Person" in the context of healthcare delivery. In particular we want to learn from you about the wisdom and power of human interactions that allow flourishing, amplify voices who have been less heard, and give rise to unexpected kindnesses in human interactions. Stories of ways in which people have positively overcome systemic assumptions and injustices are particularly encouraged. This year's theme focuses on the challenges presented in light of the turbulence caused by COVID-19 and the instances of humanity, empathy, and respect for others that continue to abound.

New This Year:

1. Nine awards (\$250) for presented **stories, reflection, poetry or testimonial**
2. Three awards (\$250) for **visual art presentation**
3. Three virtual sessions, each with a unique focus (September 14th, October 19th, and November 16th; all sessions will start at 5:30pm)

Each session will focus on a distinct aspect of the pandemic. Applicants are asked to focus on an event that happened in one of the following three "stages" of our COVID-19 experience reflecting on a specific occurrence of "Empathy and Valuing Every Person" experienced in the delivery of healthcare during COVID-19.

- **September:** Initial stages of COVID-19 during initial upheaval, and pandemic planning. **RSVP: [HERE](#)**
- **October:** Middle stages during stay at home order, PPE shortages, social distancing, caring for patients affected by COVID-19. **RSVP: [HERE](#)**
- **November:** Later stages during reopening, resumption of regular care, adjusting to the "new normal" and longer term planning. **RSVP: [HERE](#)**



Four awards will be presented at each session (one specifically for visual). Experience with public speaking is not necessary and organizers are supportive of helping individuals be comfortable in sharing their thoughts in a variety of formats.
