As an accredited Commission on Cancer (CoC) program, Cleveland Clinic Akron General McDowell Cancer Center provides the Public Reporting of Outcomes to show the results of activities completed by our cancer program as required by the American College of Surgeons (ACOS) CoC. Accreditation is granted to facilities that have demonstrated compliance with the CoC Eligibility Requirements and Standards. To maintain accreditation, cancer programs must undergo an on-site survey every three years and meet or exceed standard requirements.

Our program's Cancer Committee is responsible for monitoring, assessing and identifying changes that are needed to maintain compliance with CoC criteria.

Face-to-face visits from January to March

Art therapy tool kits provided to patients via mail or pick-up from April to November

The art therapy program worked creatively to overcome adversities this year due to COVID-19. Starting in April, the program began utilizing art therapy tool kits as a method to continue therapeutic emotional support and creative outlets to patients and their caregivers during this challenging time. The weekly kits were themed, included printed directions, as well as a recorded video, from the therapist. They were either mailed or available for pick-up at the infusion center.

ADDITIONAL PROGRAM HIGHLIGHTS INCLUDED:

- Weekly "Art Therapy at Home" program that brought fun and enjoyment to patients using simple materials throughout their house
- Weekly newsletter to patients, featuring art-related video resources on You Tube, a list of available art therapy kits, updates on the annual exhibit and inspirational quotes
- Weekly "Virtual Walk" videos from the therapist to provide socialization to patients during COVID restrictions
- Annual Exhibition of Patient Artwork is on display at the McDowell Cancer Center lobby, showcasing 16 original pieces of artwork from patients participating in the program this year
- A solo art collection is on display in the lobby from a patient who has been participating in the program since 2017



Outcomes: Art Therapy Art Therapy Accomplishments in 2020

What do you say to someone who has cancer? It's like the elephant in the room – everyone knows what is going on, but no one knows what to say. This collaborative art therapy project, created by 40 patients, addresses this question and provides insights into how to be helpful.

The design is based off of the Festival of Elephants in India, where the elephant symbolizes power, perseverance and grace through adversities. The safari grass features quotes written by patients with what they have found most helpful during their journey.

The artwork will be permanently hung in the lobby of the Infusion Center at Cleveland Clinic Akron General's Health & Wellness Center, Stow.

Outcomes: Prevention & Screening Programs Standard 8.2 – Cancer Prevention Events Standard 8.3 – Cancer Screening Events

While cancer outreach efforts were significantly impacted during 2020, the team conducted virtual forms of prevention education through marketing and PR opportunities, including:

- Advertising campaign to increase awareness of services and encourage prevention through colonoscopy screenings, make an appointment and download a treatment guide, using high-performing creative
- COVID-specific messaging focusing on safety and the importance of getting cancer symptoms checked and keeping up with annual screenings, even among the pandemic
- Advertising campaign to increase awareness of services and encourage women to make mammogram appointments, adjusting creative from 2019 to accommodate COVID-19 realities
