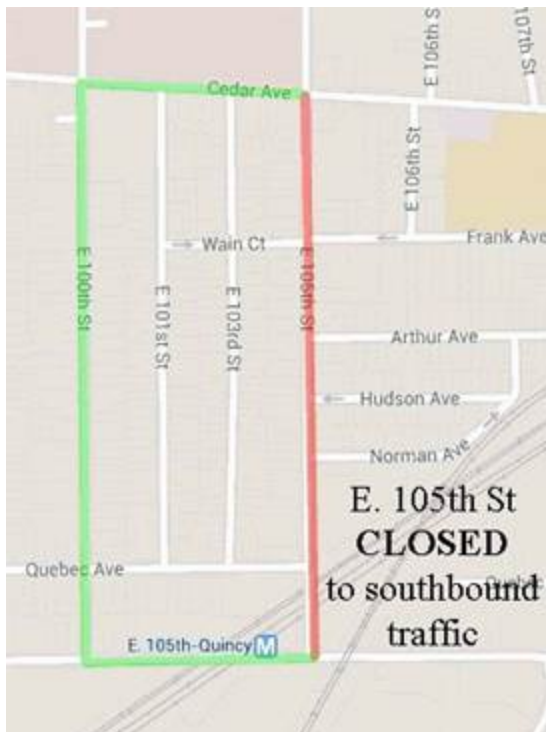


Opportunity Corridor construction will impact traffic around main campus

On Monday, April 13, construction is expected to begin on the multi-year Opportunity Corridor Project, bringing traffic changes to East 105th Street in Cleveland. The first phase of the project will involve tearing up East 105th between Quincy and Quebec Avenues in order to lay new pavement and widen the street.

Travel in the area will be impacted as follows:

- Work crews will close East 105th Street to southbound traffic between Cedar and Quincy Avenues for approximately 75 days.
- Signage will detour southbound motorists via Cedar Avenue to East 100th Street to Quincy Avenue. This will result in considerably more traffic along 100th Street and Carnegie Avenue, especially at the start and close of each workday over the 75-day period.
- East 105th Street will remain open to northbound traffic. Signage will indicate parking restrictions along the street between Cedar and Quincy.



Cleveland Clinic Police Department officers will help direct traffic around Carnegie Avenue and 100th Street, and caregivers who park in lots that could be impacted by this project will receive notices from Parking Operations.
