

2nd Year Rotations

Ambulatory Pediatrics at Fairview (1 4-week block): The 2nd year resident will provide direct patient care to infants, children, and adolescents at Fairview Comprehensive Pediatrics. Patients will be seen for routine health maintenance as well as for acute care visits. The resident will also do morning rounds with the Comprehensive Pediatric inpatient attending of the day.

On call: Home call for Family Medicine service. An average of 3-4 calls per month.

Office: Three to four half days per week.

Behavioral Science (1 4-week block): The second year resident will increase skills in differential diagnosis in psychopathology, using the DSM IVR Diagnostic manual; increase skills of family systems dynamics analysis using family systems theories; learn an integrated model of biopsychosocial outpatient counseling appropriate to primary care medical practice; increase skills in effective, flexible patient communication, including rapid physician/patient rapport; increase awareness and skill in cultural sensitivity; increase awareness of the family impact of health and illness on functioning, roles and relationships of individuals and families; use treatment planning that includes interventions about coping, physician/patient rapport, family supports and referral coordination and will increase resident knowledge to identify and discuss the interrelationships among biological, social, and psychological components of functioning in-patients.

Cardiology Rotation (1 4-week block): On this rotation the resident will learn about the pathophysiology, diagnosis and treatment of commonly encountered cardiovascular disease, increase skills in the cardiovascular physical examination and in the interpretation of EKGs; and Identify conditions which require consultation or referral to a cardiologist. Residents are given an ECG Interpretation test at the beginning of the month, which is to be turned in at the end of the month.

On call: Home call for Family Medicine service. An average of 3-4 calls per month.

Office: Three to four half days per week.

CCU at Fairview (1 4-week block): Residents will increase knowledge and skills in managing adult patients in a CCU setting; participate in admission, evaluation, treatment, and discharge patients from CCU; coordinate care of CCU patients through timely communication with the patient's family, other residents, nursing staff, and other members of the healthcare team; and actively participate in teaching rounds.

On call: Long and short calls or shift work.

Office: Half day per week.

Dermatology at CCF Main Campus (1 4-week block): Residents will learn to diagnose and treat commonly encountered dermatologic diseases; perform basic dermatologic office procedures; and identify conditions which require consultation or referral to a dermatologist.

On call: Home call for Family Medicine service. An average of 3-4 calls per month.

Office: Four half days per week.

Elective Rotation (1 4-week block): Second year residents are scheduled for one month of elective time. This elective is required to be a medicine subspecialty elective. The only time a medicine subspecialty elective is not required is if a resident is planning on taking OB as an elective, or is taking the International Health Track. (*See more information on International Health in the Curriculum Highlights below.*)

On call: Home call for Family Medicine service. An average of 3-4 calls per month.

Office: Three half days per week

Family Medicine Inpatient Service at Fairview (1 4-week block): The 2nd year resident will increase his/her knowledge and skills in managing hospitalized adult and pediatric patients. The resident will participate in the admission, evaluation, treatment, and discharge planning of any patients on the family medicine service. The resident will coordinate the care of FM patients in the hospital through timely communication with the patient's family, other residents, faculty, consultants, nursing staff, and other members of the health care team.

On call: None. Will have late stays until 9pm two days per week.

Office: Two half days per week.

Geriatrics (1 4-week block): The family medicine resident will increase the knowledge and skills necessary to provide comprehensive care of older persons and their families.

On call: Home call for Family Medicine service. An average of 3-4 calls per month.

Office: Three half days per week.

Gynecology (1 4-week block): Residents will learn the basic cognitive principles of gynecology and gain experience in fundamental gynecologic skills commonly performed by family physicians. After completion, the resident will be able to practice ambulatory gynecologic care, but will require further training to be recommended for hospital privileges for gynecologic procedures.

On call: Home call for Family Medicine service. An average of 3-4 calls per month.

Office: Three half days per week.

Health Promotion (1 4-week block): Residents will gain knowledge in health assessment, prevention of disease and disability, health promotion, health maintenance, health screening, health education, and behavior change/motivational interviewing. The resident will assess his or her own practice of health promotion/preventive medicine. The resident will learn time management skills to facilitate health promotion practice interventions. This rotation has all six second year residents on the rotation at the same time.

On call: Home call for Family Medicine service. An average of 3-4 calls per month.

Office: Three half days per week.

Management of Healthcare Systems (1 4-week block): The Management of Healthcare Systems rotation is based mainly in the Center for Family Medicine. Many different activities will occur during this month, including completion of a substantial guided self-study program to expand on knowledge of practice management issues, an "inside look" at a large HMO operation, small group sessions with practice management consultants, site visits to evaluate different practice models, dedicated time to analyze operation of the Center for Family Medicine, and assistance with job search preparation.

On call: Home call for Family Medicine service. An average of 3-4 calls per month.

Office: Four half days per week.

Pediatric Inpatient at Fairview (1 4-week block): The Inpatient Pediatric rotation consists of a one month rotation for second year family medicine residents. The rotation includes the inpatient care of assigned pediatric patients, the newborn nursery, and evaluation of patients seen through the Pediatric Emergency Department. The resident will increase his/her knowledge and skills necessary to manage hospitalized pediatric patients in a community-based hospital setting; will participate in the evaluation, admission, treatment, and discharge planning of patients on the pediatric ward and in the newborn nursery; and the resident will also increase skills in performing a comprehensive cardiovascular assessment by participating in the cardiology subspecialty clinic.

On call: Four calls per month.

Office: Three half days per week.

Sports Medicine (1 4-week block): The family medicine resident will increase his/her ability to recognize and manage common illnesses and injuries of athletes, to function as a team physician, and to identify conditions which require consultation or referral to other specialists. Occasionally, residents will be scheduled to provide sports physicals for local area high schools. This is on an as needed basis by the schools.

On call: Home call for Family Medicine service. An average of 3-4 calls per month.

Office: Three half days per week.
