Overview

This conference features more than 20 oral research presentations, 50 poster presentations and a dozen research workshops.

The goal of this conference is to disseminate research findings and evidence-based information to clinicians who will use the new knowledge to replicate studies, translate findings to improve patient care quality, safety and outcomes, and to improve evidence-based infrastructure and processes. The focus is on building a capacity for scientific inquiry among attendees. The conference will feature presentations by and for clinical and academic attendees, with time allotted between sessions for formal and informal networking. To enhance knowledge related to methodological issues, the conference will feature 12 workshops (basic and advanced) presented by content experts (statisticians, editors, writers and researchers). - 4. Enhance attendees' knowledge of research processes and clinical research through discussion, networking and expert-led workshops.

Keynote Speakers



Pamela Z. Cacchione, PhD. CRNP. BC. FGSA, FAAN, is the Ralston House Term Chair in Gerontological Nursing, an Associate Professor of Geropsychiatric Nursing at the University of Pennsylvania School of Nursing, and a Penn Nursing Center for Health Care Innovation Fellow. Dr. Cacchione received her BSN from Villanova University College of Nursing, her MSN as a Gerontological Nurse Practitioner from Marymount University School of Nursing, and her PhD from Saint Louis University School of Nursing. She completed a National Institute of Nursing Research-funded postdoctoral research fellowship at The University of Iowa College of Nursing focused on delirium in sensory-impaired, rural older adults in long-term care. Dr. Cacchione has worked as Gerontological Nurse Practitioner at a PACE program and is currently a nurse scientist at Penn Presbyterian Medical Center. Her program of research has evolved from an exploration of sensory impairment in older adults to the usability and acceptability of technology (robotics) among older adults. Dr. Cacchione serves on the editorial boards of the Journal of Gerontological Nursing and Research in Gerontological Nursing and she is Editor of Clinical Nursing Research, An International Journal. Dr. Cacchione has been honored for her accomplishments and inducted as a fellow in the Gerontological Society of America and the American Academy of Nursing.



Rita H. Pickler, PhD, RN, FAAN, is The FloAnn Sours Eaton Professor of Child and Adolescent Health and Director of the PhD and MS in Nursing Science Programs at The Ohio State University College of Nursing. She is also a Contingent Nurse Scientist at Nationwide Children's Hospital. She received her BS and MS in Nursing from the University of North Carolina at Greensboro and her PhD from the University of Virginia. She also holds a post-master's certificate as a pediatric nurse practitioner from Virginia Commonwealth University. Dr. Pickler has been studying the care of preterm infants since 1980 and preterm infant feeding care since 1990. Since 2001 her work has included measurement of neurodevelopmental outcomes associated with feeding care, and particularly with oral feeding. She has been continuously funded by the National Institutes of Health (NIH) for her research for 18 years, currently serving on the National Advisory Council for Nursing Research at the NIH. She has been teaching and mentoring nurses and nursing students since 1981 and is committed to preparing the next generation of scientists who are interested in improving health outcomes for those most in need. She is passionate about good science and its implementation in clinical practice. She has been honored for her research accomplishments in many ways, including induction into the American Academy of Nursing and the Sigma Theta Tau International Nurse Researcher Hall of Fame.
