We invite submissions to give one of three short talks reflecting on this theme in the delivery of healthcare. This can be from the perspective of receiving empathy or providing empathy. The presentation can take a number of formats:

- Personal reflection
- Testimonial
- Story about a powerful experience

Submissions will be encouraged from mentees, colleagues, students/trainees, patients, friends, as well as from any employee within Cleveland Clinic. Experience with public speaking is not necessary and organizers are supportive of helping individuals be comfortable in sharing their thoughts in a variety of formats.
