

- Recognized pharmacy caregivers with Patient Hero Awards and Medication Safety Awards


AUTOMATION, INNOVATION AND TECHNOLOGY

- Established pharmacy services and assisted with the opening of Mentor Hospital
- Hosted the inaugural Medication Analytics Safety and Technology (MAST) Conference
- Implemented key technology platforms, such as Pyxis and Logistics ES at Union Hospital, achieving full integration across the entire health system
- Installed Parata Coreflex automation at Specialty, Home Delivery, and Adherence pharmacies



- Implemented GYANT AI text bot in transitions of care at Ohio hospitals for post-discharge outreach
- Automated JW and JZ modifier for waste billing
- Redesigned Pharmacy Patient Scoring (PPS) tool to align core services across the enterprise
- APOTECA PS implemented across Ohio and Florida. Over 90% of all chemotherapy agents now compounded on a gravimetric technology-assisted workflow device





CONTINUOUS IMPROVEMENT

- Florida Research and Innovation Center increased volume and repackaged 4081 unique medications and 1,896,225 individual doses
- Expanded transitions of care services



 Heart failure medication reconciliations increased from 30% to 68.1%

- Piloted Main Campus heart failure services:

- Thirty-day heart failure readmission rate decreased to 6.4% in the pilot cohort compared to 16.5% for all HVTI patients
- Two-way MyChart messaging implemented for medication adherence outreach
- Implemented quality assurance program for the Emergency Department culture callback service
- Akron General expanded Code Blue Pharmacist Response to provide 24/7 coverage
- Added four new pharmacies to enterprise pharmacy services
 - Martin Health (2)
 - Middleburg Heights FHC
 - Union Hospital
- Implemented the dose optimization and monitoring consult service across the enterprise

REVENUE AND COST SAVINGS

- Florida Research and Innovation Center saved \$556,000 through repackaging pharmacy
- Community prescription growth of 18% and revenue growth of 24% at Main Campus

Increased outpatient prescription volume by



- 16% at Akron GeneralBiosimilar and generic conversion enterprise wide resulted
- in over \$13.9 million in savings
- Converted to vasopressin ready-to-use vials, saving \$1,000,000
- Established billing infrastructure for ambulatory telephone encounters in Epic, generating an estimated \$18,843 in new revenue over three months

RESEARCH AND EDUCATION

- Established a PGY-1 Community Pharmacy Practice Residency in Specialty Pharmacy
- Redesigned Main Campus Intern Program to include clinical rotation opportunities for all interns. 13 summer research projects completed
- Launched the Research Newsletter in September for quarterly distribution
- Created 15-part Research Curriculum




- 19% utilization across pharmacy caregivers

- 269 users accessed content 700 times

- Pharmacy Research Advisor Network (RAN) created in to connect caregivers with peers who can provide specialized research support
- Launched the Pharmacy Research Traineeship
- Pharmacy Enterprise achieved an 83% increase in CNCI score from 2022
 - The Category Normalized Citation Impact (CNCI) score is generated annually from publications indexed in web of science, normalized for subject area, year, and article type
