Staffing 15 weekends per year (30 x 8-hour shifts) and 2 Cleveland Clinic-recognized holidays (subject to change depending on department needs)		
Participation in pharmacy residency on-call program (activities and number of shifts are dependent on departmental needs, minimum 12 x 6-hr on site shifts)		
Participation in the post-ICU recovery clinic (minimum 8 clinics, approximately 1-2 patients per clinic (estimated 15-30 min/patient))		
Participation in the longitudinal emergency response rotation according to the schedule		
Completion of all PharmAcademic evaluations		
A resident must achieve for the residency (ACHR) all objectives in R1. A resident must also ACHR 80% of the objectives in all other required domains. By the end of the residency, there can be no objectives that are rated as Needs Improvement not followed by a Satisfactory Progress or Achieved during the residency.
