

PGY2 residency programs build upon Doctor of Pharmacy (PharmD) education and PGY1 pharmacy residency training to develop pharmacist practitioners with knowledge, skills, and abilities as defined in the educational competency areas, goals, and objectives for advanced practice areas. Residents who successfully complete PGY2 residency programs are prepared for advanced patient care or other specialized positions, and board certification in the advanced practice area, if available.

The Oncology PGY2 Residency is a one-year training program that provides an opportunity for the resident to develop the necessary skills for specialized practice in oncology pharmacy. The program provides the clinical experiences and leadership needed to create a well-rounded, competent oncology pharmacist or clinical specialist.

The resident will develop knowledge and expertise in many aspects of oncology therapeutics. This knowledge base will allow the resident to contribute independently to an interdisciplinary health care team by offering therapeutic interventions to treat, cure, rehabilitate and alleviate medical conditions and disease unique to cancer patients. The program will also enhance problem solving skills, oncology research and communication skills. Required rotations include solid tumor oncology, leukemia, bone marrow transplant, lymphoma/myeloma, pediatric oncology, management/investigational drug service. The resident may also choose electives in a variety of different areas listed below. Additionally, other elective learning experiences may be developed based on resident interest and preceptor availability. The resident will participate in pharmacy journal club, case conference, drug and disease state presentations during oncology weekly, student topic discussions and presentations, and review of chemotherapy order sets. They will also conduct a research project, medication use evaluation and present a one-hour seminar.

## **Program Structure**

Residency program experiences include a combination of concentrated, extended, and longitudinal rotation experiences. Residents must complete all required rotations and 2 elective rotations. Availability of experiences are as follows:
