

Department of Pharmacy PGY2 Solid Organ Transplant Residency

## **Program Purpose**

The Solid Organ Transplant PGY2 residency program builds upon Doctor of Pharmacy (PharmD) education and PGY1 pharmacy residency training to develop pharmacist practitioners with knowledge, skills, and abilities as defined in the educational competency areas, goals, and objectives for advanced practice areas. Residents who successfully complete this PGY2 residency program are prepared for advanced patient care or other specialized positions, and board certification in Solid Organ Transplant pharmacy.

## **Program Structure**

Residency program experiences include a combination of concentrated, extended, and longitudinal rotation experiences. Residents must complete 4 elective rotations. Availability of experiences are as follows:

Outpatient Transplant	Longitudinal Minimum of 40 weeks (1/2 day per week or full day every other)	Required	N/A
Transplant Staffing Weekends	Longitudinal, 15 weekends/year (Total of 30 8-hr shifts)	Required	N/A
Small Project	Longitudinal, minimum of 48 weeks (~2-3 hours/week) <sup>1</sup> See research timeline for details	Required	N/A
Large Project	Longitudinal, minimum of 48 weeks (~3-5 hours/week) <sup>1</sup> See research timeline for details	Required	N/A
On-Call	Longitudinal, minimum of 48 weeks (minimum 10 24-hour shifts <sup>2</sup> )	Required	N/A
Presentations/Education	Longitudinal, minimum of 48 weeks (~2-5 hours/month) <sup>1</sup>	Required	N/A
Transplant Leadership and Formulary Management	Longitudinal, minimum of 48 weeks (~1-2 hours/month) <sup>1</sup>	Required	N/A
