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Staffing minimum of 15 weekends per year (30 x 8-hour shifts) and 2 Cleveland Clinic-recognized holidays (subject to change depending on department needs)	
Participation in pharmacy residency on-call program (activities and number of shifts are dependent on departmental needs, minimum of 12 x 6-hour on site shifts)	
Participation in the pharmacy 2CLOT service as the primary responder for at least 30 shifts (shift = minimum of 4 hours of holding the pager), this can be completed as a part of weekend staffing and/or clinical rotations	
Completion of all PharmAcademic evaluations	
A resident must achieve for the residency (ACHR) all objectives in R1 (Patient Care). A resident must also ACHR 80% of the objectives in all other required domains. By the end of the residency, there can be no objectives that are rated as Needs Improvement not followed by a Satisfactory Progress or Achieved during the residency
