Requirements for Successful Completion of Residency Program

Criteria	Date Completed																								
Ohio Pharmacist Licensure (as soon as possible, but must be licensed within 90 days of start date)																									
Completion of required patient care experiences as required by Competencies and Goals Appendix (See Core Areas and Types of Patient Care Experiences tracking document)																									
Successful completion of each of the required rotation areas (see Program Purpose and Structure document)																									
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Completion of a large residency research project <i>Project to be determined</i>																									
Manuscript (in publishable form) written and submitted to the RPD																									
Completion of a small residency research project or drug use evaluation <i>Project to be determined</i>																									
Completion and presentation of at least one formulary review monograph <i>Monograph to be assigned</i>																									
Present according to the schedule agreed upon by both the Resident and Residency Program Director at the beginning of the residency year																									
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Present and/or attend the Ohio College of Clinical Pharmacy Fall and Spring meetings, Great Lakes Pharmacy Residency Conference or other regional conference, Vizient/American Society of Health-System Pharmacists Midyear Clinical Meeting, and/or Society of Critical Care Congress at the discretion of the Residency Program Director and Residency Committee (based on travel limitations imposed by Cleveland Clinic).																									
Staffing 15 weekends per year (30 eight-hour shifts) and 2 Cleveland Clinic-recognized holidays (subject to change depending on department needs)																									
Participation in pharmacy residency on-call program (activities and number of shifts are dependent on departmental needs, minimum 10 shifts)																									
Participation in the post-ICU recovery clinic (minimum 8 clinics)																									
Participation in the longitudinal emergency response rotation according to the schedule																									
Successful completion of the residency goals and objectives as defined in the Successful Completion of the Residency Policy. The resident must achieve all goals in R1. A resident may have 2 goals in other domains that are not achieved by the end of residency. By the end of the residency, there can be no objectives that are rated as Needs Improvement not followed by a Satisfactory Progress during the residency.
