

Requirements for Successful Completion of PGY2 Emergency Medicine Residency 2023-2024

Criteria	Completion Date																												
Attainment of Ohio pharmacist licensure as soon as possible (required within 90 days of start date)																													
Attainment of AHA Basic Life Support (BLS) and Advanced Cardiovascular Life Support (ACLS) certifications by the end of the residency																													
Successful completion in each of the required rotation areas																													
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Staffing 15 weekends, 1 major holiday, and 1 minor holiday during the residency year																													
Participation in pharmacy resident on-call program according to schedule (minimum of 10 shifts)																													
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Attend Society for Academic Emergency Medicine (SAEM) Annual Meeting																													
Completion of a residency research project (large project)																													
Completion of at least one drug use evaluation or quality improvement project (small project)																													
Completion of at least one formulary review monograph																													
A manuscript (in publishable form) submitted to the residency director prior to the end of residency																													
Successful completion of the Appendix of the <i>ASHP Required Competency Areas, Goals, and Objectives for Emergency Medicine Postgraduate Year Two (PGY2) Pharmacy Residencies (Topic Tracker)</i>																													
Successful completion of the residency goals and objectives as defined in the Successful Completion of Residency Policy. The resident must achieve all goals in R1. A resident may have 2 goals in other domains that are not achieved. By the end of the residency, there can be no objectives that are rated as Needs Improvement that are not followed by a Satisfactory Progress.
